RE: Rectification of the business affairs regarding
the rights for Norway/Sweden

Dear Sifu:

With this letter I would like to rectify the
following:

1) On 03/21/2001 I drove Sihing Emin Boztepe, while he was in Germany, to a seminar in Brakel. Already a few months earlier I was thinking about taking on the task as chief instructor in Norway and Sweden, as I have many relatives and acquaintances also amongst business people which provide me with the most favorable prerequisites. During the journey I approached Sihing Emin Boztepe and suggested to him to transfer the rights for Sweden and Norway to me.

Initially, Sihing Emin was very surprised that I was showing an interest for this task. During the course of our conversation, I convinced him that I could very well fulfill the task in Sweden and Norway and Emin Boztepe thus agreed to transfer the rights for Sweden and Norway to me. We did not speak about financial matters at all that day. We both knew that we would come to a satisfactory result due to our deep trust in each other and our long and friendly relations. In following conversations I was always accurately and honestly informed by my Sihing about decisions and financial contracts. The claim and especially the transfer of territorial rights to the Danes in your open letter caused me further confusion as I had insight into a private cell phone message from you to Sihing Emin, in which you confirmed the transfer of rights to me as long as I would pay my fees for Sweden and Norway in a correct manner.

2) It has never been my intention to acquire instructors from others. During the time around the 25th anniversary, I made an effort to surprise my Sihing Emin Boztepe with well-attended seminars. I put my energy into making Emin Boztepe's seminar a success. I was never interested in the past or during the time of the 25th anniversary to talk badly about you, my Sifu Kernspecht or to discredit the EWTO and/or to take away instructors from others.

My Dear Sifu:

The events of last week force me to write you the following letter. I am writing this letter with great respect for you as a person, for your unequalled life achievements within the EWTO and your excellence as an instructor.

For the past few years I have always defended the EWTO and you personally in front of third parties with words and actions, and I have always stood up for you. Lately, I had to experience how my big EWTO family was falling apart. I have never wanted this development and I wished all along that a peaceful and for all parties, happy solution could have been found for this conflict between my Sihing, Emin Boztepe and you, my dear Sifu Kernspecht. Well, destiny has been determined otherwise and life has taken another course!

Apart from our long and shared life paths, my Sihing Emin Boztepe and I have been connected through a deep and honest friendship. Emin Boztepe was the one who got me in touch with the art of WT for the first time. The excellent teacher he was, he meticulously built me up piece by piece. Thanks to him, WT has become my life's core. Through his friendship and persistence, he consistently led me back into the arms of the EWTO family, especially in the beginning when I still had doubts, and he instructed me to dive well into the depth of the WT arts.

Despite of the painful experiences caused by the destruction of the EWTO family, it is only natural that I will stay at Emin Boztepe's side due to our long and in confidence growing relationship.

Apart from the tight connection with Emin Boztepe there have been other reasons related to you, my dear Sifu Kernspecht that made me come to this conclusion. Throughout all these years, I have attempted to honor the art of WT, to teach it respectfully and further it by working hard and consistently reinvent myself internally. Nevertheless, you have repeatedly favored others. Students who started later than me graduated

as Sifu before me and often there has been gossip about me.

Without seeking to have a personal conversation with me, you have made judgments about me based on the talk of others. I would have liked to rectify these judgments eye to eye with you. I have always signaled you my wish for growth. You noticed it, but you never supported it.

Your recently published open letter regarding the affairs in Sweden and Norway, have also disappointed me. With 100% honesty, Sihing Emin kept me constantly informed about the course and facts of your contractual meetings and conditions. All this leads me to the conclusion that here again I was a means to an end for nasty slander said by you which damaged not only my reputation, but also Sihing Emin's.

Born from my desire to further my development and growth, I had the idea to acquire the rights as chief instructor. I approached Emin Boztepe with this, instead of him making me the offer. Long before the personal talk with Emin Boztepe, I was thinking that my prerequisites for this task were especially favorable. I have always been interested in these countries. I have many relatives in Sweden and Norway and through my relations, I know many business people, who would have strongly supported me in building and expanding the EWTO in Norway and Sweden. As you can see, it would have been a worthwhile task for me and therefore I informed my Sihing Emin Boztepe about my interest in these rights.

I mourn the loss of a great and old family and look forward to the tasks and challenges of a growing new family with joy and curiosity. I say my good-byes with this letter and declare my resignation from the EWTO.
